"How Shall We Then Live?"

Part 7: "Submitting to Christ ... It's a Good Thing!"



Romans 13:1-14

Introduction: *"There is no <u>authority</u> except from God, and those that exist have been <u>instituted</u> by God" (Romans 13:1)*

Titus 3:1-2:

I Peter 2:13-17: "Live as people who are <u>free</u>, not using your freedom as a cover-up for evil, but living as <u>servants</u> of <u>God</u>" (vs. 16).

Matthew 22:21:

- Jesus said, "Seek <u>first</u> the <u>kingdom</u> of God and HIS righteousness" (Matthew 6:33).
- Disciples of Jesus Christ must seek FIRST God's kingdom at all times, and so much as possible be subject to human authority.
- Acts 5:27-30: "We must obey <u>God</u> rather than <u>men</u>" (vs. 29).

I. Human government has been established by God ...

Since mankind <u>rebelled</u> against God and <u>rejected</u> His authority, God established government to <u>rule</u> over sinful people.

I Samuel 8:1-7:

Human government is always <u>under</u> GOD's authority, whether those in positions of <u>power</u> recognize it or not.

Daniel 3:17:

John 19:10-11:

- Human government has been established by God and has only <u>delegated</u> authority. It has no authority except what GOD has given it.
- II. The proper role of government and the Christian's response ...

Romans 13:3-5:

A major part of the God-given role of government is to <u>punish</u> those who do <u>evil</u>, who break the law.

I Peter 2:13-15:

Hebrews 13:17:

- God established government to bring <u>order</u> out of what would otherwise be <u>chaos</u> due to the sinful, rebellious nature of people!
- Government is given the right to "<u>bear</u> the <u>sword</u>," (Romans 13:4) to execute judgment in order to <u>protect</u> those under their authority from evil.
- The authority of human government, from a <u>biblical</u> point of view, is very <u>narrow</u>.
- When human government exercises its God-given authority, disciples of Jesus are called to <u>______</u>submit___ by living in <u>______</u>obedience____.

III. The improper role of government and the Christian's response ...

Ephesians 6:1:

- God does not call us to obey anything that is <u>directly</u> <u>contrary</u> to His clear commands in His Word.
- Our Constitution and the "Bill of Rights" were based on the Christian principle of God's <u>sovereignty</u> as our <u>Creator</u>.

Romans 13:8-10:

Loving your neighbor means pointing them to <u>Christ</u> by what you <u>say</u> and by what you <u>do</u>!

Romans 13:11-14:

- Disciples of Christ are <u>called</u> and <u>sent</u> into the world to be <u>salt</u> and <u>light</u>.
- **Ephesians 5:6-16:** "Look carefully then how you walk, not as <u>unwise</u>, but as <u>wise</u>, making the best use of the <u>time</u> ..." (vss. 15-16).
- **Colossians 3:23-24:** *"Whatever you do, <u>work</u> <u>heartily</u>, as for the Lord, and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the <u>inheritance</u> as your reward. You are serving the Lord <u>Christ</u>."*
