Matthew 23:25-28; Hebrews 4:12-13


Key Truth: If you are not after God's heart you are not pursuing what really matters in life, and an <u>unguarded</u> heart will inevitably wander away from this pursuit.

I. Saul: Flouting God's Heart

1 Samuel 13:1-14a

The <u>pressures</u> of life <u>reveal</u> what is in your heart.

1 Peter 1:7



Through the pressure of these circumstances his lack of trust in and commitment to God was <u>drawn</u> out and <u>exposed</u>.

Psalm 139:23-24, "Search me, O God, and know my heart! <u>Try</u> me and know my thoughts! And see if there be any grievous way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting!

II. David: After God's Heart
