Zeal for God's Name

1 Samuel 17

Introduction: "'<u>David</u> and <u>Goliath</u>' has become a stock phrase for any 'little guy' who takes on and defeats a bigger, stronger foe, whether in war, sports, business, or politics." - Richard Phillips

1 Peter 5:6-7

Goliath is called a "<u>champion</u>." The Hebrew expression means a "man between the two."

Goliath was approximately <u>9</u> feet <u>6</u> inches tall.

Goliath's coat of mail weighed about 126 pounds.

The point of Goliath's spear weighed about 15 pounds.

The word translated "<u>defy</u>" appears <u>six</u> times in the chapter: 17:10, 25, 26, 36, 45

Key Truth: When you have a zeal for God's name you'll have the <u>perspective</u>, <u>motivation</u>, and <u>courage</u> to fight evil.

I. The <u>Perspective</u> to Fight Evil

David's <u>zeal</u> for God's name gave him a completely different perspective from everyone else.

III. The **Courage** to Fight Evil

These stones would range from <u>two</u> to <u>three</u> inches in diameter, and when flung from the sling of a skilled warrior they could reach speeds of <u>100</u> to <u>150</u> miles per hour!
